Ribbons will be awarded through six places in each class

- A. All Native North American upland game birds and waterfowl
- B. Ring-necked pheasants
- C. Hungarian partridges
- D. Chukor partridges
- E. *Coturnix* ssp. (Japanese quail, pharaoh quail, etc.)
- F. Rock Doves (ie., pigeons, excluding ornamental pigeons)

Ornamental game birds are defined as: All avian species excluding those named above and chickens.

1. Henderson County and all adjoining counties can participate in the Exotic Poultry Show.
2. Only healthy birds will be allowed to enter. Pullorum testing must be done prior to the show by Entry Deadline Date. A copy of Pullorum results must accompany entry cards. Only birds reacting negative to this test will be allowed on the grounds.
3. All breeds and species will compete together within the various classes unless otherwise specified by the superintendent.
4. Exhibitors must be present during judging and have additional holders available. All game bird entries may be dismissed at the discretion of the Superintendent.
5. All exhibitors are required to keep their exhibit cleaned and fed.
6. Pens will be provided by show.
7. Pen of three game birds must be of the same species and placed on feed nine weeks prior to show.
8. There is no limit to the number of entries an exhibitor can enter in the Game and Ornamental Bird Show.
9. All Game and Ornamental Bird entries must be identified according to breed.
10. Pen of three game birds must consist of one male and two female birds
