

Princess Contest
Rules and Regulations
General rules and regulations of show apply

See official show schedule for all show times

1. All 4-H, FFA Chapters and Rodeo Clubs in Henderson County or in school districts which take in part of Henderson County are eligible to have a contestant for the Livestock Show Princess. Each Contestant must be eligible to enter and must be entered in at least one other Livestock Show Division.
2. The Princess must be 9 through 13 years of age as of August 31, and will be selected for poise, beauty, personality, western attire and horsemanship. The panel will consist of three judges.
3. This contest is open to anyone in a club or chapter. (A club or chapter may have more than one Princess contestant.) All clubs and/or chapters must have their contestants selected and entered on or about February 2nd.
4. There will be three practice sessions. Princess nominees and their horses are required to attend and participate in at least two of the practice sessions.
5. The princess must be present at all contests for awards presentation and help in other activities as she is asked to do so by the Livestock Show; represent the Livestock Show Association in fairs, rodeos, parades, etc. throughout the year and be present for the crowning of the following year's Princess.
6. The Princess and winners of all categories will be required to work during the HCLS Premium Auction. Any absences must have board approval in advance. Any contestants absent without board approval will be disqualified.
7. Obtain applications from the association secretary. Send entries to princess contest superintendent.
8. Judges for princess contest must not reside in Henderson County, unless approved by the board.
9. No stallions allowed to be ridden in the Queen and Princess contest←
