

HCLS POULTRY SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

Ribbons will be awarded through six places in each class.

1. Only healthy birds will be allowed to enter competition. Birds will be checked for diseases and parasites before they are placed in cages. All poultry will be tested for Pullorum Disease and Fowl Typhoid by the State at no cost to the exhibitor. Only birds reacting negative to these tests will be allowed on the grounds. Broilers will be bought from an approved hatchery and won't be tested. Health papers are not required. This will be done before by Entry Deadline Date.
2. All breeds will compete together within the various classes unless otherwise specified.
3. The superintendent reserves the right to re arrange classes if entries are especially heavy in some classes and light in others.
4. Entry blanks not showing date of hatch, age and breed of the entry will be classified at the discretion of the superintendent.
5. All exhibitors must be present for the judging. Only the judge and the superintendent will be allowed in the judging arena. Upon conclusion of judging, the public may then view birds and results.

6. Exhibitors will be allowed to sell their entries on the fairgrounds after the official judging at private treaty except for the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Broilers.
7. Pens will be provided by show. If exhibitor has unusually large or small birds, they must bring their own cages.
8. All broilers will be received by exhibitors (6) weeks prior to show and are to be placed on feed at that time.
9. Each broiler exhibitor will be required to start the project with a minimum of 25 birds. However, if there is more than one child in a family ordering chickens, the family doesn't have to order 25 birds for each child.
10. Each broiler exhibitor will be able to show and sell two pens of broilers.
11. A pen of broilers will consist of 3 uniform birds
12. Exhibitors of Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Pens of Broilers must sell at the Premium Auction. Up to Fifteen (15) pens of broilers, designated to be of Premium Sale quality by the official judge, may sell in the Premium Auction. Any pen of broilers pulled from the Premium Sale will be replaced in the sale by the next highest placing pen of broilers and all other pens of broilers will be moved up in the sale order. These exhibitors will be responsible for distribution of their broilers to the buyers. If buyer desires, broilers must be killed, dressed and placed in plastic bags ready for freezer.
13. All exhibitors will be required to keep their exhibit clean and fed.
14. All poultry exhibits must be identified according to breed.
15. All poultry must be owned by the immediate family of the exhibitor and reported to the association secretary by Entry Deadline Date.
16. Exhibitors will be responsible for getting their broilers to the Premium Sale.
17. Exhibitors may bring only one (1) broiler to the sale. Buyer will be informed that they will receive three birds. All broilers will be identified with wing bands. The Poultry Superintendent will be responsible for banding all broilers.
