Contest Information/Rules:

1. All 4-H clubs and FFA chapters that are eligible to participate in the Henderson County Livestock Show may have contestants in the Queen & Princess contest.
2. Queen contestants must be 14-19 years of age (eligible for participation in HCLS) and Princess contestants must be enrolled in at least third grade and 8 years old OR 9-13 years of age as of August 31st.
3. Queen and Princess will be selected for poise/personality, interview, attire, speaking and scrapbook (provided).
4. Entry forms are due by February 1st, 2025 to the extension office or the contest superintendent by 5:00 PM.
5. The entry fee for the competition is \$25.00, checks can be made payable to HCLS.

6. There will be at least 3 practice sessions, contestants are required to attend scheduled practices unless they have made arrangements with the contest superintendent. Scrapbooks will be given at the first practice.
7. The contestants who are crowned Queen & Princess must be present at all events during the week of the Henderson County Livestock Show, unless they are participating in the event. Runner-Up winners will be required to be present at all events throughout the week as needed, unless they are participating in the event.
8. Throughout the year, the Queen and Princess will be asked to attend events that promote the HCLS, and other community activities within the county.
9. Both the Queen and Princess are required to attend the crowning ceremony at the conclusion of their year.
10. **ALL** contestants are required to work the Premium Auction on Saturday of the year they ran for Queen or Princess. Contestants who do not work the auction may be disqualified from competing in the future. Excused absences must be approved by the HCLS board and contest superintendent.
11. Previous winners are ineligible.
12. All judges must reside outside of Henderson County unless board approval has been granted.
